A Patient with Acute Appendicitis Usually Has a Loss of Appetite

If the patient is hungry, a diagnosis of acute appendicitis should be questioned.

That patients with appendicitis have usually lost their appetites is a confirmed clinical pearl. In a study of 267 patients operated upon for acute appendicitis,

Gonclaves et al. found that 86% had anorexia.

Perhaps the "stick in the memory" pearl is:

Beware of opening the belly of the hungry patient.
