Glucose variability during the early course of acute pancreatitis predicts two-year probability of new-onset diabetes: A prospective longitudinal cohort study

Acute pancreatitis (AP) is a major contributor to diabetes of the exocrine pancreas. Now High glucose variability (GV) during early stage of AP gives a clue to warning of worsening HbA1c pattern and new-onset diabetes after discharge from hospital. So GV assessment during hospitalisation can be a good preposition for early recognition of patients who are at high risk for new-onset diabetes after AP.
